(c) SUBCOMMITTEE SELECT ON WEAPONIZATION OF THE FEDERAL GOVERN-MENT.—Section 1(a)(2)(A) of House Resolution 12, as agreed to January 10, 2023, is amended by striking "together with not more than 13 other Members, Delegates, or the Resident Commissioner appointed by the Speaker, of whom not more than 5 shall be appointed in consultation with the minority leader" and inserting "together with not more than 12 other Members, Delegates, or the Resident Commissioner appointed by the Speaker, of whom not more than 9 shall be appointed in consultation with the minority leader".
