

A bill to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require additional information in disclosures of foreign gifts and contracts from foreign sources, restrict contracts with certain foreign entities and foreign countries of concern, require certain staff and faculty to report foreign gifts and contracts, and require disclosure of certain foreign investments within endowments; with an amendment (Rept. 118-278).

H.R. 6479. A bill to limit the availability of a plea deal for any person responsible for the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001; to the Committee on the Judiciary.

By Mr. VASQUEZ (for himself, Ms. SA-LINAS, Ms. CRAIG, and Mr. VARGAS):

H.R. 6480. A bill to provide for conditional lawful permanent residency for certain aliens; to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Congress has the power to enact this legislation pursuant to the following:

Article 1, Section 8

The single subject of this legislation is:

To limit the availability of a plea deal for any person responsible for the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001.

By Mr. VASQUEZ:

H.R. 6480.

Congress has the power to enact this legislation pursuant to the following:

Article 1, section 8, Clauses 1 and 18 of the United States Constitution, to provide for the general welfare and make all laws necessary and proper to carry out the powers of the Congress.

The single subject of this legislation is: Immigration Reform
