HONORING WORLD WAR II VETERAN JOHN WARD

IN HONOR OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Mr. PAYNE. Mr. Speaker, I rise today to honor one of the greatest Americans, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

STEFANIK CENSURE RESOLUTION
