H. CON. RES. 84

Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate concurring),

SECTION 1. USE OF EMANCIPATION HALL FOR CEREMONY TO PRESENT CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL TO "GHOST ARMY".

(a) AUTHORIZATION.—Emancipation Hall in the Capitol Visitor Center is authorized to be
