**SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

This Act may be cited as the “End Human Trafficking in  
Government Contracts Act of 2022”.

**SEC. 2. IMPLEMENTATION OF TRAFFICKING IN CONTRACTING PROVI-  
SIONS.**

(a) **REQUIREMENT TO REFER VIOLATIONS TO AGENCY SUSPEN-  
SION AND DEBARMENT OFFICIAL.**—Section 1704(c)(1) of the National  
Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2013 (Public Law 112–  
239; 22 U.S.C. 7104b(c)(1)) is amended—

(1) by inserting “refer the matter to the agency suspension  
and debarment official and” before “consider taking one of  
the following actions”; and

(2) by striking subparagraph (G).

(b) **REPORT ON IMPLEMENTATION OF TRAFFICKING IN CON-  
TRACTING PROVISIONS.**—Not later than 90 days after the date of  
the enactment of this Act, the Director of the Office of Management  
and Budget shall submit to Congress a report on implementation  
of title XVII of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal  
Year 2013 (Public Law 112–239; 126 Stat. 2092).
